Even though Luke's account of the Transfiguration of Christ is a little different than what we find in the other gospels, the message should still be clear, especially in this Lenten season. In this time we are reminded of the need to change our lives, a conversion of heart, a transfiguration. How do we do this? Our décor in church is to remind us a little of the desert, of forty days spent in prayer. In our reading we hear of Jesus' climbing a mountain to get closer to God, to spend some time in prayer. All that's left now is our involvement, an action and reaction to what this season is about. We can abstain from meat and eat all the fish we want. We can fast and pray, be more charitable, attend the Stations of the Cross and other devotions, but unless we attempt to change our lives or even welcome the opportunity the rest makes no sense? Our Christian brothers and sisters who claim to be "born again" do so because they have accepted Jesus as their personal Lord & Savior. While the bible doesn't say anywhere that we have to do this, it doesn't sound that bad!?!? We must ask ourselves then "have I accepted him into my life and am I open to change?" Maybe when we do so, when we finally listen to and hear him we too will be transfigured for it is then that we will experience new life!!!
