Sorrow, remorse, guilt, repentance, confess, forgiveness, penance.


One might think this is a reflection on the process of the Sacrament of Reconciliation? While this order wasn't planned, it's panned out that way. Truly these words reflect the season we celebrate. But to say we "celebrate" in the midst of such sorrow and guilt seems awkward, for to celebrate brings joyful thoughts and a possible celebration, doesn't it? This is where change must come in because this season calls us to a new sense of self, of awareness and new life. Oftentimes we reflect so much on Jesus' suffering and our need to die to self that we fail to see that our sharing in this can bring about growth. This season, as gloomy as it seems should be one then too of rejoicing! Three weeks ago on the Second Sunday of Lent when we heard of Our Lord's transfiguration on the mount, a local catholic college passed out photocopied postcards before mass. The picture on the front of the card showed a high, snowcapped mountain with the words printed across the top "Wish you were here!" For all of us Jesus' transfiguration is His alone, and while it was meant to help strengthen the apostles for Our Lord's impending death, it also calls each of us to focus on our own ability to follow the Lord, to brush aside our own desires joyfully and to celebrate the transfigured life we've been given. The gloom and the guilt of this season should really reflect the opportunity we have and our willingness to share in the resurrected new life of Christ by living out our baptism call. The opportunity we have every day to celebrate new life in ourselves should be freely accepted and even longed for. Let's ask ourselves...am I having a **Happy Lent** filled with change and new birth? Where are you then in your walk with Christ? At the top or the bottom of the hill?
