

PALM SUNDAY OR PASSION SUNDAY?

Today we celebrate a day that serves as a catapult, tossing us, throwing us, inviting us to take part in the life of Christ. Now we're always encouraged to pattern our lives on that of Jesus. Yet this Sunday's gospels give us two different views of the same Christ? We open up with the Gospel of Luke, Chapt. 19 with palms in hand celebrating the triumphal entry of our Messiah and King into Jerusalem. Lets think like the people! Now besides Jesus saying that "this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" when speaking about the coming of the Messiah. He has never called himself this otherwise. He will sometimes speak of himself as the Son of man, a title given to royalty. Being of the lineage of David, he has royal roots? But he never says I am your Messiah, I am your King, I am your Savior! Instead, Jesus unassumingly rides into Jerusalem upon a colt and the people proclaim Him as their Messiah! What were they thinking? Had they seen or heard about him? Had they traced this carpenters Davidic line? Do you think Jesus waived to the crowds "Yep, it's me!" Maybe they expected troops to follow and the Romans to be overthrown as the savior entered... and it didn't happen? And then "WHAM!!!" Their upset turns into anger and rage! Then we read from Luke, Chapt. 22-23 and they're ready to hand Him over to be crucified! Why the change of mind? To what extent did he fail to uphold their ideals as Messiah and King? Following in His ways, where do we stand? Traditionally, we enter this week with sorrow in mind remembering Jesus' suffering for our sakes and the giving of a "Christian" example on which to pattern our lives. But we also have an advantage - we know He is our Messiah and King! We know that the Resurrection can be ours if we die to self in this life so to rise again in the life to come! We know of the gift of salvation! We live in His light...they did not, they didn't know? We know these things! The question is whether they form our lives in joy and in sorrow?
