because of time constraints even before we celebrate Palm Sunday, I have cause to think about what it is that we are going to celebrate? As we celebrate every holy day, obligatory or not, we do so year in and year out, the same liturgical celebrations over and over again. Even in our own homes the traditions we celebrate are done so "traditionally" every year. So as I write this IO days prior to Easter Sunday I have to think, and we should all ask ourselves "what is different about this year?" What is different? If the season we just celebrated is to be one of change and conversion, renewal and new life, how has it affected us? As we celebrate the season of New Life, let us open ourselves to the opportunity set before us as we celebrate what we hope to join in resurrected and new life in Christ Jesus, our Risen Lord!
