The portrayal of "the doubting Thomas" is a biblical story that we're all very familiar with, even to the point

that anyone who doubts might be associated with the phrase. It seems only appropriate then that the Second Sunday of Easter is associated with Christ the Divine Mercy. It was only 7 years ago that our late Holy Father, Pope John Paul II promulgated that forever be it known that the Second Sunday of Easter would now be known as Divine Mercy Sunday! But prior to this association, doubt seemed to reign (and unfortunately still does) over whether we needed another pious celebration or devotion to our Lord. Many priests refused to celebrate the two together. For most it was the Second Sunday of Easter and that's it! Yet much of our pontiff's life revolved around the mercy of God, from his time as a seminarian hiding from the Nazi soldiers or as an Archbishop under the watchful eye of the KGB and even as Pope having taken on a bullet that many say was guided, as if by the hand of God Himself past major organs and even his heart. Why then the association this 2nd week with the Divine Mercy? One has only to look at the world around us and question whether it can get any worse? But if we fail to see the reality, doubt can set in too, for us? We can look as far as the Middle East where some say we're on the brink of the 3rd world war or we can look as close as the streets of Butler or even the break in and theft in our parish school. Crime, hate, prejudice, drugs, murder and moral decay - its all there, unfortunately these things can be found in our own neighborhoods, or even in our own homes! And what about our hearts? Are we then in need of God's mercy? Can we feel any need to look at Christ and plead for forgiveness, for "mercy on us and on the whole world" as the Chaplet of Mercy pleads? Maybe Christ the Divine Mercy is just another popular devotion, but its desire in seeking holiness and its plea for mercy are needed greatly in our world and in our lives! Doubt can be a terrible fiend if it cause's us to fail in faith, in love and in our need to constantly seek God's mercy, especially through Christ His Son and our Lord. Think about it the next time you look at your neighbor with displeasure and then doubt the need for God's mercy in your life? Jesus, I Trust in You! Be merciful!
