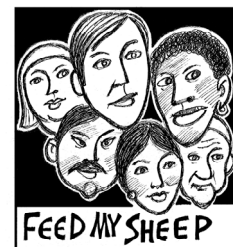

Throughout the Easter Season we will hear of Christ appearing to His disciples again and again and again. These appearances are pretty much the same – Jesus appearing behind locked doors or on the beach or along the road, offering peace to those present and eating with them. Odd? He breaks bread with the disciples in Emmaus then disappears, so he must not eat much? But when he appears in the upper room he asks “do you have anything to eat?” They give him a piece of cooked fish and he eats it there in their presence. On this Third Sunday of Easter Jesus has a charcoal fire with bread and fish and invites them to “come and have breakfast!” One might think that they eat a lot, but at the same time we continue to see the risen Lord commit himself to his caring ministry over and over again. We could say that caring was at the very center of His life and now it’s no different in resurrected life!
