LOAVES & FISH!!!



Shamefully, I went looking for last years "pastors corner" for this week, knowing that it was on file in the computer, for I had seen it from time to time? I didn't go looking for it so that I could use it again, but to see what I had written. Why? Because as I thought about this corner reflection the first thing that hit me was the same title I had used last year – "loaves & fish – loaves & fish!" In a funny kind of way, this is what goes through my head when I have unfortunately put too few hosts out to be consecrated for the next mass. As we run low and it looks like we may not have enough at communion time, I think to myself, asking God for the miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fish. Such was the case in the first century. When thinking of Jesus it was hard for the early church not to associate Him with fish. Either, he was multiplying them in the field or in the net, cooking them on a fire at the beach, eating them after he had been risen from the dead, or telling his disciples, "follow me and I will make you fishers of men." **In many ways then, as Christ was so giving of himself especially as we receive Him in the Eucharist, so too are we to recognize our responsibility to give of ourselves to each other!** In an almost heretical point, some scripture scholars have stated that the *giving* was the actual miracle? Some think that as Jesus showed how to give from His want, in the few loaves and fish that He had, others reclining on the mountainside after his great sermon, gave what food they may be carrying with them and in turn the multiplication of fish, of loaves, of love! Well then, the question must be for us whether we give of ourselves and our gifts? Furthermore, is the question of whether we multiply the gifts we've received? In other words, it's nice to show that act of kindness, but if that act doesn't lead to other acts or cause others to act, how then are we like Christ? How then are we giving, as Christ was continuous in His giving, if we only give that one time or even every once in a while? Ultimately, from this day and in our giving we should learn to do as Christ asked us at the last Supper... "Do this in Remembrance of Me!"
