Harden not your hearts

This week's gospel puts us in familiar

territory, hearing a prayer - the prayer - the Lord's Prayer prayed by Christians everywhere for centuries. Familiar territory because its almost second nature to us. A part of our vocabulary - a part of us. Many of us have prayed this prayer since we were little, possibly before we even made our First Communion. Maybe it was in a Catholic school or C.C.D. program? Maybe when our families prayed together in the home, at meals or during a family rosary? Whenever it may have been, when we did learn it surely we learned more than just the words? Surely we learned what they meant and hopefully they filled our heart? Hopefully the prayer became ours in thought, word and action? Hopefully??? For it seems that this popular prayer we say so often is just that, something we say and fail to pray? The problem then does stem from our need to make it our prayer to our Father. To make it as such, we have to take the words to heart! But, in order to be forgiven we must also learn how to forgive. Our Lord knows our hearts? Surely we don't think that we can get away with seeking forgiveness without giving it? "Do not subject us to the final test" asks us how important our faith is to us? We might say "deliver us from evil" so as in the case of the martyr, would we give up our faith, give up eternal life that we might save our life here on earth? May we not be tested to the point of death! With all of this in mind, do we say or pray to Our Father in heaven?
