WHO CARES???

Do you remember the last time you may have seen someone who needed some kind of help? Maybe they were standing on the side of the road, their vehicle in need of mending? Maybe in the grocery store parking lot,



their bags to heavy to lift? Maybe it was the beggar on Main Street? Maybe the television portrayed the needy in South Africa? Maybe someone needed help around the house? What was the response they needed to receive and what response did we give? Whether aloud or within, did we care? In this weeks gospel, Jesus is being watched closely as he attends a dinner given by one of the leading Pharisees. In turn, Jesus is watching the invited guests as they seek a place of importance at table. In an all too familiar statement, given to us last week as well, Jesus eventually proclaims that "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted!" Here, Jesus' remarks remind us about our truest identity in relation to God. As deeply humble people we come to God empty and open ourselves to God's filling us with what is lasting. This reward - everlasting life at God's heavenly banquet! This will be ours if we but treat others as God treats us. To receive dignity and respect, we must bestow this same dignity and respect with generosity on others. It is God who exalts us, not our own choosing or actions. It is God who repays us with the most unimaginable gift of all - everlasting life! Humility then helps us refocus our limited vision and relationship into an enduring perspective which keeps our focus on God. Who cares? God cares! Do you? All in all, the church prays at the end of our earthly life that we might be in the presence of God. Think about it though? Have our loved ones truly deserved the reward of everlasting life - because of their humility and respect of others? Because of their faith, their love, their following in His ways? Do they deserve eternal life? Maybe we should pray that they might? Maybe we should pray that we might too!


